When he laid his hands on her, immediately she stood up straight and began praising God. But the leader of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had cured on the Sabbath, kept saying to the crowd, "There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be cured and not on the Sabbath day." The Rev. Dr. Annemarie S. Kidder is an ordained minister in the PC(USA). Originally from Germany, she came to the US on a Rotary scholarship. She has earned graduate degrees from the University of Berlin, the University of Missouri-Columbia, and The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, where she also earned a Ph.D. in systematic theology and New Testament literature. Pastor Annemarie was also an associate professor at the Ecumenical Theological Seminary in Detroit, and she is the author or editor of ten books in theology and biblical literature. Having retired last fall, she now serves part-time as a chaplain at Trinity Health Senior Community in Ann Arbor and as a parish associate at Kirk in the Hills. She lives in Ann Arbor with her cat, Willie.
